

Whitehill and Bordon Relief Road, Southern Section

Hampshire County Council will be starting work on the two mile southern section of the Whitehill and Bordon relief road on 21 October 2016. The £20 million major scheme will join up with phase one (Louisburg Avenue), to create a new relief road to the west of the area, with a dedicated path for pedestrians and cyclists.

The southern section will pass between the garrison redevelopment area and Hogmoor Inclosure. It will include a double roundabout junction at the southern tie in with the A325. In addition, two traffic light controlled junctions; one to access the new garrison housing development and the second at the intersection with Oakhanger Road will be provided. The work is planned to be complete in the Summer of 2018.

- 21 October 2016 – start of phase two main works
- Summer 2018 – estimated completion of phase two
